

I met Ethan recently when I dropped in on his art class, and he generously provided his talent to this request ensuring first nation culture and Erindale student art appear in central office.

During my time at Erindale I have also visited a number of partner schools including Calwell High School, Wanniasa School and Chisholm School. At each school I visited the Hospitality Trade Training and spoke to principals and staff who

confirmed the value of this strategic investment in vocational education on High School campuses. Students are highly motivated by the industry learning, achieving vocational certificates to complement their Year 10 Certificates.

I also observed the schools are invested in providing students with individualised project learning, often with an explicit 'creative' emphasis linked to STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). My discussions with Kris Willis, Principal at Caroline Chisholm regarding the future construction of a STEM centre at his campus servicing Tuggeranong schools is both innovative and an opportunity for the local schools to lead the ACT. Erindale College will be an active stakeholder in this development ensuring a strong STEM course pathway for college students.

## VET WORK PLACEMENTS

Erindale College offers a range of Vocational Courses where students can work towards a nationally recognised certificate. We currently offer:

- Certificate II in Business
- Certificate II in Community Services
- Certificate II in Sport and Recreation
- Certificate I in Furnishing
- Certificate II in Hospitality
- Certificate II in Kitchen Operations
- Certificate II in Music

In order for students to be

granted a vocational qualification they need to achieve the competencies in the course and do a work placement, known as Structure Workplace Learning (SWL). If students undertake an SWL placement while in years 11 or 12, it can contribute towards points for their ACT Senior Secondary Certificate.

By undertaking an SWL students will develop knowledge, skills and attitudes that are relevant to and recognised in their particular industry. This allows them the opportunity to receive training in an industry context and gain understanding of the variety of roles and responsibilities in the workplace. It will assist them to make informed career choices and is also a valuable way to make industry contacts.

If students wish to pursue this opportunity they should talk to their VET teacher and the Careers teachers in eknex.

Parents and other community members are encouraged to consider taking on a work placement student in their work place or business through the SWL or work experience programs. Please get in touch with Vanessa Sargeant or Stephen Smith at Erindale College if you would like to support our students in this way.



## CAREERS NOTICES

### UNIVERSITY / CIT / APPRENTICESHIP APPLICATIONS

University applications are now open. CIT and other providers are also open.

Students applying to Universities need to be aware of the closing date of 30<sup>th</sup> September.

Students thinking of CIT or similar courses should be aware of differences between training organisations.

Students looking for work and apprenticeships should be applying now.

### UNIVERSITY APPLICATIONS

**30<sup>th</sup> September Deadline** - Students must apply to UAC or interstate and pay by 30<sup>th</sup> September. After that date there is a \$125.00 late fee. 30<sup>th</sup> September cut off also applies to Special Consideration / Disadvantage (EAS) and Schools Recommendation (SRS) applications. In some cases students may need to apply directly to the university if an interview or audition is required.

If students are looking for university accommodation they should look at applying now, don't wait to receive an offer.

**Schools Recommendation Schemes (SRS)** or more commonly known as Principal's Recommendation. Most universities have some sort of Principal recommendation entry pathway, it is not all universities and it is not all courses. Through UAC it is known as SRS. If students are applying through this they must tick the SRS box on their UAC application and they should come and talk to Vanessa or Stephen in Careers or Principal Michael Hall.

**Educational Access Schemes (EAS).** If students have experienced long term educational disadvantage, they may be eligible for extra ATAR points. This scheme is administered by UAC with students needing to apply for it. In many cases students that would be eligible for extra points do not apply.

### CIT AND OTHER TRAINING ORGANISATIONS

Canberra Institute of Technology (CIT) provides training from short taster programs up to 3 year degrees. It is a TAFE college similar to TAFE colleges in NSW. It provides training in a huge range of areas, Business, Nursing, Photography, Building trades etc. There are many private training organisations that provide similar courses. All are accredited and offer the same course; a Diploma in Business from CIT will be exactly the same courses as a Diploma in Business from a private company that offers it. Students looking at these areas should consider both private and public training opportunities. There are different costs, different delivery methods and also the length of the course will vary.

### APPRENTICESHIPS AND JOB APPLICATIONS

If students are thinking of an apprenticeship and applying for a job they must have a presentable resume, an awareness of the job application process, what to say in an interview, what to wear and to follow up afterwards. We are here to help, come and talk to us, bring your resume in if you aren't sure about it.

Most large organisations have applications through their websites and many through job websites but often the most successful way of gaining a job is through work experience. There is still time for students in Year 12 to do work experience that will connect them directly with an employer.

### National X-Country Championships at Mt Stromlo



### A YEAR OF EXPERIENCE FOR JACKSON FREW


