RESPONSIBLE SERVICE OF ALCOHOL (RSA) TRAINING AT ERINDALE COLLEGE WEDNESDAY 17 MAY 2017.

If you want to work in a job that involves serving or selling alcohol within Australia, you need to complete the Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) training. On completion of the course you will receive an RSA certificate which is recognised in the ACT. RSA training provides sellers of alcohol education on preventing intoxication, drunk driving and underage drinking.

This unit covers the RSA skill and knowledge requirements common to all States and Territories. Some legislative requirements and knowledge will differ across borders. In some cases after completion of this unit, state and territory liquor authorities require candidates to complete a bridging course to address these specific differences.
