**2019 Student Timetables** available in link today.

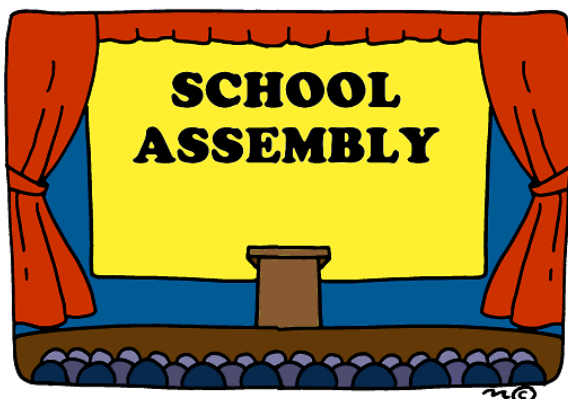

First Prize - \$250 cash for the winner and \$200 for the school:

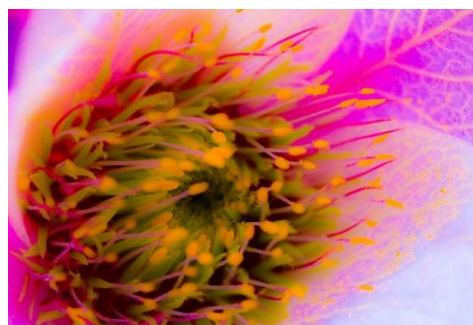
