




LEARNER PROFILE

The design is a circle supporting the student at the centre. This represents our inclusive culture. The attributes work together and interact to prepare our students for the future.




POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING


Using the same student at the centre design, our behaviour expectations represent the support around every student at Frindale.

Life doesn't always follow a straight path. Erindale College has a key group of staff to support student wellbeing s that students are able to achieve academic and career goals.


Link teachers are the major point of contact for any social, emotional or academic matters relating to student life at College. Link coordinators will follow students through two years of College, and can connect students to other services, such as the school psychologist or social worker.

Link coordinators also monitor attendance and engagement with classes, and can assist students through processes such as special consideration, class changes or academic progress checks.

ERINDALE SPORTS ACADEMY AND TALENTED SPORTS PROGRAM

The Erindale Sports Academy provides an environment where student athletes are supported to excel in their academic and sporting pursuits, whilst building the skills required to be successful in life beyond College.

A strong focus on personal development, working with others, determination and being goal orientated is expected of all students within the Talented Sports Academy.



Programs are tailored to meet the individual athlete's needs and sporting requirements in close consultation with coaches and sporting organisations.

Students are provided with adequate time and access to the facilities they need to develop their specialised skills. Local and interstate competitions form an exciting part of the sports program.

TECHNOLOGY AND CREATIVE ARTS

Arts Institutions and Universities are seeking students who possess creative talents and the ability to analyse. Employers are demanding creative thinkers who are effective communicators, who have teamwork and well-developed interpersonal skills.

Subject specific spaces, modern technologies and proactive, skilled arts educators combine to offer students a number of pathways to excite their curiosity and provide opportunities to excel in creativity, aesthetic appreciation, critical analysis, exhibitions and live performance.



We look to spark a passion in students and enable their ability to seek challenges and rewards in Creative Arts and Technology. This is accomplished through the provision of student-centred learning experiences that are real and relevant to the student, accompanied by a focus on the skills of collaboration, critical thinking and creativity.

The Technology and Creative Arts Academy provides a wide range of experiences and programs to engage students, promote their growth intellectually, develop greater social and personal development, resilience and selfesteem.

ENGLISH HUMANITIES ACADEMY

The English and Languages Academy offers subjects that build 21st century skills in collaboration, critical and creative thinking, to meet the challenges of a changing world.

English units are structured around encouraging students to consider the world and their place within it - Who shapes the future? How do you know what is true? Where have I come from and where am I going? These units are designed to be relevant to students and the issues they face both now and in the future.

Tertiary English courses empower students to achieve the academic skills and rigour necessary for success at University. We have guest lecturers from ANU and UC who offer seminars about Creative Writing and English. Courses also encourage students to polish pieces of assessment that can be used for portfolio entry into Bachelor courses at the University of Canberra, along with entrance into writing competitions or other opportunities. Our teachers are passionate about literacy, language and literature, and are avid readers and writers who also write for publications.



Accredited and Contemporary English courses are designed and developed to give students access to core critical literacy skills required for engaging with the ever-changing modern world. These courses incorporate workplace skills with broad areas of curriculum focus in order to foster a sense of wonder and a love of lifelong learning.

The ACT Scaling Test (AST) Familiarization program is also run by the English and Languages Academy and delivered through LINK and lunchtime sessions. This program is designed to make students familiar with the expectations and process of the AST in order to prepare them for the test, which is conducted across two days in September each year. If a student is studying a Tertiary package, and wishes to obtain an ATAR, then the sitting of the AST is compulsory. Attendance at the familiarization program sessions is strongly encouraged.

Erindale College is able to facilitate all language courses through the Canberra Academy of Languages (CAL). CAL courses are delivered to BSSS Standards, and count towards the Senior Secondary Certificate requirements.

MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE & IT ACADEMY

The Mathematics, Science and Information Technology Academy offers a full range of courses in Mathematics and Science in both T and A streams.

Studying Mathematics at Erindale College provides pathways to university, CIT, and other training providers. Students learn to apply mathematical ideas and techniques, while transferable skills are gained through the communication of ideas and concepts, teamwork and the use of appropriate technology and applied problem-solving. Top students have the ability to enrol in Specialist Mathematics to complete either a major-minor or double major and participate in a range of competitions including the Australian Mathematics Competition and the ANU Maths Day.

Science is a prerequisite for further studies and employment in engineering, architecture, environmental studies and health sciences, including nursing, medicine, and dentistry. Students with a Science subject on their ACT Senior Secondary Certificate are favoured by the CIT and most trades prefer students with Science in their background.



Students within Science courses are encouraged to participate in a range of National and International Science competitions including the National Titration Competition run through the Royal Australian Chemical Institute.

Digital Technologies provide students with the tools and skills required to actively engage in a technologically diverse world, encouraging students to make informed, social, and ethical decisions when using new and emerging technologies. Our courses are a basis for further education and employment in the IT industry in a range of fields including programming, web development, robotics, and games development. IT students are encouraged to participate in the Computational and Algorithmic Thinking Competition and the CyberTaipan Competition, which pits our students against a range of cybersecurity challenges. CyberTaipan is run with the support of the CSIRO and is based on the US Air Force Association's CyberPatriot program.

Our Flight course and Drone Technology registered unit offer opportunities for future pathways at a tertiary or vocational level and employment within a broad range of occupations in the civil or military field of aviation.

HONOURS & COLLEGE AMBASSADOR PROGRAMS

The Erindale College Honours program (Yrs 10-12) is a challenging, student-centred way of learning, valuing academic excellence and ensuring that students are realising individual potential. Our students seeking to be personally challenged, will pursue extension or enrichment opportunities tailored to their unique passions.

Students will have the support to excel in their chosen field, make new connections and networks, and gain valuable skills and experiences for their futures. Students will build an e-portfolio as evidence of their learning journey of enrichment and extension.

The College Ambassadors Program (CAP) enables aspiring student leaders to engage within the Erindale College community through a variety of roles. Student voice is valued and represents the diversity of cultural, ethnic and gender backgrounds of our Erindale College community. CAP students meet regularly with key Erindale College staff including; the Principal, Deputy Principals and Transition and Careers Officer. CAP students are ambassadors for action in improving College life. They have an important role representing our student voice at public forums and events.





COMPASS PROGRAM

The Compass Program is designed to support students with a disability. It provides individualised and diverse learning pathways that promote self-sufficiency and enables our students to acquire the skills they need to succeed in school, work and relationships. This is achieved through personalised pastoral care, inclusive classes and courses, and small group instruction

All students in the Compass Program are offered a Study Skills class where they develop effective time management skills and study habits. Students also use their time in this class to seek one-on-one support to complete assignments and prepare for exams as needed.



To qualify for the Compass
Program (LSU) or the Inclusion
Support Program (ISP) students
must have completed Year 10
studies in a disability education
program or be assessed by a
school psychologist as meeting
the criteria for placement
within either program.

YEAR 10 PROGRAM

Erindale College offers a Year 10 program for students who are gifted and talented in their field of sporting, dance, or academics. To be accepted into the Year 10 Program, all students must be able to demonstrate selfmanagement skills, academic success and a commitment to schooling. They can apply to the Talented Sports Program (TSP), Talented Dance Program (TDP) or Academic Honours Program.

Students in Year 10 complete Australian Curriculum courses in Mathematics, English, History, Science and Physical Education with advanced academic and enrichment options.



All Year 10 students are enrolled in a Year 10 LINK pastoral care class where students study health and wellbeing.


Student progress at College is closely monitored and supervised by their LINK teacher. In addition to the core units, students can select a number of elective courses which vary from year to year and may include Food Technology, Music, Art, Furniture Making, Sports Science and Sport and Recreation.

Students interested in the program must complete a Year 10 application form, available from the Erindale College website. For selection, students are also required to complete Reading, Science and Numeracy Testing.

TALENTED DANCE PROGRAM

Erindale College's Talented Dance Program (TDP) is designed to challenge and support the talents of our dance students. The program focuses on dance performance, technique, strength, flexibility and fitness. Dancers will be provided the opportunity to develop their skills in creating and presenting their own choreography and working collaboratively is a key component to the program.

TDP students will be challenged to improve their dance technique in a range of styles, including jazz, lyrical, musical theatre, hip hop, commercial and ballet. This broad range allows students to gain a solid knowledge of techniques and encourages them to develop versatility within their dance repertoire, leading to more well-rounded dancers.



Prospective TDP students will need to submit an expression of interest form to the college. Students will then be invited to participate in an audition process, which will include a workshop technique class covering several styles, a short interview, and presentation of a 1 minute solo piece in the style of your choice.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

Vocational Education and
Training (VET) refers to education
and training that focuses on
delivering skills and knowledge
required for specific industries.
It supports young people's
preparations and transitions to
employment, vocational and
higher education pathways.

Other benefits of participating in VET include obtaining practical experience from work, gaining insight into how workplaces operate, developing employability skills, improving interpersonal skills and allowing students to identify and explore potential career paths.

MINDYIGARI CENTRE FOR EXCELLENCE

The Mindyigari Centre for Excellence offers a space for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to access social, emotional, and academic assistance while at college. The Mindyigari Centre has the support of Ngunnawal elders, university and community members.

The central paths represent the tracks towards the school, a meeting place for the students and community. For Lani, this community is based in the Mindyigari Centre of Excellence at Erindale College where she worked alongside staff and students to develop her leadership skills.





CAREERS

Erindale College offers a comprehensive program and services to students delivered by the Careers Team made up of our qualified Career Practitioner and WEX/ASbA Coordinator. The team offers programs and services that assist students in making decisions on their future pathways and transition into College and beyond.

Work experience is highly encouraged throughout the year and offers a diverse and extensive range of placements. Erindale College believes Work Experience is an essential element to prepare for work opportunities beyond College.

Students at Erindale College are supported to participate in Australian School-based Apprenticeships which involves the employment of a young person who is undertaking a traineeship part time while attending College and completing the ACT Secondary School Certificate.


Our Careers Team is committed to assisting students to successfully transition into Erindale College and into tertiary or other study, an apprenticeship, a traineeship or employment.



The careers team offers the following services:

- Job application assistance, scholarship and future enrolments
- Resume writing and interview techniques
- Career expositions with a variety of community, education and industry representatives
- Excursions to tertiary institutions, CIT and industry taster/information days
- Industry training such as First Aid, Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA), White Card and Asbestos Awareness Training on campus each term
- Pathway's planning a personal development program for students to explore their interests and develop a pathway plan to assist them to achieve their goals

What are you doing now?


Diploma of Performing Arts at Transit Dance in Melbourne
