The activities included a rocket challenge where students used water and air pressure to launch a rocket, a glider challenge which involved investigating how weight impacts on the flight of a glider, attempting to fly a plane on the VR flight simulator, a maths murder mystery, identifying unknown chemicals and substances in the science lab and a presentation from a UK laser scientist.


TECHNOLOGY AND CREATIVE ARTS STUDENTS EXPERIENCE ART


Q AND A HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS SPECIAL

STUDENT INJURY: INSURANCE AND AMBULANCE TRANSPORT



The Education Directorate does not provide any insurance cover for injury, disease or illness to students resulting from school activities or school-organised excursions. Claims for compensation are met where there is a legal liability to do so. Liability is not automatic and depends on the circumstances in which any injury, disease or illness was sustained.

As there is no automatic insurance cover for personal injury if your child is injured at school or during a school organised activity/excursion you should therefore consider whether taking

out personal insurance cover for your child if warranted.

This insurance might cover contingencies including medical/hospital expenses, ambulance transport outside the ACT, and cancellation of transport/accommodation or loss of/damage to luggage.

The ACT Ambulance Service provides free ambulance transport for students who are injured or suddenly become ill at school or during an approved school organised activity **within the ACT**.

VEHICLE MAINTENANCE

Gold Creek Motors Gungahlin Service Department conducts free Community Auto Nights at Gold Creek Motors in Gungahlin every 2 months. They have now designed a new program for high school and college students as well as parents and teachers. They teach you how to correctly check your tyre pressures, change a flat tyre, care for your car, how to replace wiper blades, install globes, check oil levels and what oil to use etc. They also have a car set up on a hoist showing everybody underneath a vehicle and explaining how brakes etc work. This gives everybody a good understanding of how a car functions and items to watch out for. They emphasise safety in everything they discuss and demonstrate. They even explain what to do in the event of a minor car accident.



If you are interested in attending one of these events specifically for Erindale College, please come and put your name down at the front office. We must have a minimum of 20 students and a maximum of 40, if you are under the age of 18 you must also be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

In his race Kye rode strongly throughout the course, achieving the highest speed of any rider in his division of 60.212kmh, finally finishing just 4 seconds behind the winner.
